Short description

practice-theatre was a project tutored by Ian White in collaboration with Emma Hedditch, Jimmy Robert and Myriam van Imschoot. practice-theatre was a cumulative project that sought to explore and question, through performance, the various aspects of what the place of theatre means to us and how it might be used in our work. Each month the project expanded and enacted ideas around a different aspect of theatre – with what's done one month mapping onto the next – to consider the positions from which we speak, how we act, and what, through different frames, speaking and action might be.

The course included a trip to Senegal in May with the entire Dutch Art Institute student body and faculty, including tutor Ian White. After several days in Dakar, the practice-threatre group spent a week at the Ecole des Sables, a dance company and school for African dance in the village Toubab Dialaw. They used the facilities to create and rehearse a new piece. This resulted in the performance 'Routine', which was first presented in public space in Dakar, hosted by Raw Material Company in conjunction with presentations of other DAI projects. A second iteration of 'Routine' was presented in Arnhem in July, after a two-day workshop in Arnhem with tutors Ian White and Jimmy Robert.

The course included:

- Monthly meetings at the Dutch Art Institute in Arnhem;
- Visits to the City hall and City theatre (Stadsschouwburg) in Arnhem;
- Visit to If I Can't Dance's presentation of Guy de Cointet's 'Five Sisters' at Frascati Theatre in Amsterdam (28 & 29-10-11)
- Visit to If I Can't Dance's programme Class of Masters with Matt Mullican, Nicole Beutler, Vanessa Desclaux, Suchan Kinoshita, Joachim Robbrecht, and Johan Simons at Frascati Theatre in Amsterdam (22 & 23-01-12);
- Trip to Dakar, Senegal and a stay at Ecole des Sables in the village of Toubab Dialaw.
